Research papers must be submitted electronically in pdf following the instructions to be announced at the HDMS'07 web site (http://hdms07.di.uoa.gr). Submitted papers should not exceed twelve (12) pages following the official ACM Proceedings format (available at: http://www.acm.org/sigs/ pubs/proceed/template.html). Accepted papers will be included in informal proceedings to be distributed on site. Works to be considered for the PhD forum should not exceed four (4) pages in the aforementioned format, and should outline the topic of research and present current results as well as the expected contribution of the doctoral dissertation. Proposals for tutorials, panels and research prototype demonstrations should not exceed two (2) pages, including the speakers, panellists, and the general concept of the proposal. Works to be considered for the PhD forum must be submitted by email to the PhD forum Chair (vassalos@aueb.gr). Proposals for tutorials, panels and research prototype demonstrations must be submitted by email to the PC chair (ytheod@unipi.gr).
